Pathway to new Franklin County Justice Center

Mr. Hueter showed the Board two designs for a proposed entry and pathway to what will be called the Franklin County Justice Center. Some things considered are: aesthetics, affordability, serviceability and access. The Board told Mr. Hueter to work with Jail Captain Rick Long, Security Director Rich Rochleau and others and return with a recommendation. Mr. Hueter noted that a change order will be needed.

Cypress Drive

Mr. Mahoney reviewed proposed Cypress Drive road designs. There was discussion about rebuilding of the road.

I think that is the situation we find ourselves in. So I would move that we reject all bids on CRP 601 Phase III project and immediately move to reissue an invitation for bids on that project.
