

### CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman, Rick Miller called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN PRESENTATION

Port of Pasco Executive Director Randy Hayden addressed the Board stating a committee consisting of representatives from Franklin County, City of Pasco, City of Connell, City of Kahlotus, Port of Pasco and TRIDEC has met over the past four months to discuss their organizations' role in updating Franklin County's Economic Development Plan. He stated the plan was last updated in 2009 and the Committee's specific goal was to create a proposed update for the County's use of the State of Washington Tax Deferral Program for local economic development efforts, also known as the, ".09 Economic Development Fund" or, ".09 Fund."

Mr. Hayden gave a brief history of the .09 Fund explaining how the fund would benefit Franklin County. He reviewed the financial trend from 2011-2015, stating the fund balance was approximately 1.8 million. Mr. Hayden explained the debt service obligation will end in 2022 so collections would increase at a faster rate after that year. The committee wanted to reserve \$350,000 for the debt service obligation and approximately one-million dollars (\$1,000,000) for urgent projects that may emerge outside the annual funding cycle. Mr. Hayden added that no one project would exceed \$500,000 without Committee recommendation and Board approval.



Commission Miller asked about the \$100,000 set aside for TRAC. County Administrator Keith Johnson explained the \$100,000 was an estimate of what would be contributed to TRAC from the .09 Fund which had not been specifically budgeted in previous years. Mr. Johnson explained Board action was not necessary at this time, but was asking for a consensus to move forward with scheduling a public hearing.

The Board gave consensus and thanked Mr. Hayden for his presentation and thanked the committee members for being here today.

# APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE 03-2016 GRANTING A ZONE CHANGE, ZC 2016-02 OF APPROXIMATELY 4.33 ACRES WITHIN CITY OF PASCO'S URBAN GROWTH AREA

Building and Planning Director Jerrod MacPherson and Building and Planning Assistant Director Greg Wendt presented a zone change (ZC 2016-02) recommendation of 4.33 acres within City of Pasco's Urban Growth Area (UGA). Mr. Wendt informed the Board the Planning Commission heard the proposed zone change April 4, 2016 and recommended approval with five (5) findings of fact and four (4) conditions of approval.

\* After discussion, Commissioner Bob Koch moved to grant approval of ZC 2016-02, subject to five (5) findings of fact and four (4) conditions of approval. Commissioner Brad Peck seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

# APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE 03-2016 GRANTING A ZONE CHANGE, ZC 2016-03 FROM RESIDENTIAL TRANSITION TO RESIDENTIAL SUBURBAN OF APPROXIMATELY 76.11 ACRES

Building and Planning Director Jerrod MacPherson and Building and Planning Assistant Director Greg Wendt presented a zone change (ZC 2016-03) recommendation of approximately 76.11 acres of land from Residential Transition (R-T) to Residential Suburban 20.00 (RS-20) within City of Pasco's UGA. Mr. Wendt explained the Planning Commission heard the proposed zone change April 5, 2016 and recommended approval with five (5) findings of fact and three (3) conditions of approval.

\* After discussion, Commissioner Bob Koch moved to grant approval of ZC 2016-02, subject to five (5) findings of fact and three (3) conditions of approval. Commissioner Brad Peck seconded and the motion carried unanimously.



# APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2016-171 GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP 2016-02) APPLICATION TO UTILIZE AN EXISITNG ACCESSORY BUILDING AS AN ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT

Commissioner Peck stated he had met with Mr. MacPherson and Mr. Wendt regarding his concerns from the April 20, 2016 Regular Board meeting and all concerns had been addressed to his satisfaction.

Commissioner Peck stated Mr. MacPherson and Mr. Wendt had done a great job addressing his concerns and he appreciation for their professionalism.

\* After discussion, Commissioner Koch moved to grant approval of CUP-2016-02, subject to six (6) findings of fact and six (6) conditions of approval. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried unanimously

## FUNDING REQUEST FROM PACIFIC NORTHWEST AVIATION MUSEUM

Commissioner Peck explained local citizens dedicated to preserving Tri-Cities history had undertaken restoration of the 1942 Navy control tower at Tri-Cities Airport and recommended \$10,000 from historic preservation funds be used for this project. He explained the current balance of the historic preservation fund was \$107,000.

\* Commissioner Koch moved to approve the interagency agreement authorizing up to \$10,000 for the preservation of the Pacific Northwest Aviation Museum. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

# APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2016-172 GRANTING AN INTER-BUDGET TRANSFER FOR WAGES OWED IN CORONER'S OFFICE

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave explained the County is required to pay non-exempt employees for every hour worked and the department head must report those hours.

Coroner Dan Blasdel stated it was recently discovered the on-call Deputy Coroner had not accurately reported all hours worked in 2015. Because of this, it was necessary for the Board to approve an inter-budget transfer of \$4,771.77 from 2016 Current Expense/Non-Departmental to Contingency/Salary & Benefits.



\* After discussion, Commissioner Peck moved to approve a budget transfer to fund the payment for hours worked in accordance with an accurate reporting of hours worked. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

## APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2016-173 GRANTING A PETITION FOR VACATION OF A PORTION OF CANAL BOULEVARD

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney addressed the Commission stating his office received a petition signed by six (6) land owners asking that a portion of the Canal Boulevard be vacated. As required, the petition was accompanied by a cash bond. He explained no action was required at this time. If the Board wishes to consider the request, a public hearing would be scheduled, after which, the vacation would be presented to the board for approval.

Discussion ensued regarding the County's portion of the road and the possibility of land-locking a portion of the area and ways to avoid that from happening.

Commissioner Peck suggested the Board consider the request with the caveat that land-locking and other issues be addressed through the proper road vacation process.

\* Commissioner Koch moved to approve Resolution 2016-173 ordering the county engineer report on the possible vacation of a portion of Canal Boulevard so the Board may consider the usefulness of such road. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried unanimously.
