CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Koch led the Pledge of Allegiance

PUBLIC HEARING

Planning and Building Director Loren Wiltse addressed the Board regarding Ordinance 05-2017. Franklin County is proposing to amend the Franklin County Code, Title 15 Buildings and Construction, Chapter 15.2, Section 15.12.230 Permit Expiration and Revalidation. This amendment seeks to ensure the Franklin County building permits expiration dates may be extended when substantial progress is being made.

Commissioner Koch recessed into a Public Hearing at 9:13 a.m., to hear testimony regarding amendment to Ordinance 05-2017.

Mr. Steve Schelgel presented his current circumstance to the Board and the reasoning of why he supports the amendment. Mr. Schelgel obtained his permit to build. During this process he incurred a delay in building due to winter weather conditions which inhibited his progression. The building permit Mr. Schelgel obtained did not permit him to extend time needed to finish the task.

Mr. Roger Lenk also agreed that there should be an amendment to Ordinance 05-2017 which would allow an extension of time for those who encounter obstacles unforeseen and unavoidable. Reasons such as weather, inspector delays, coordinating with Committees, obtaining bids and permits all take unspecified amounts of time.

Commissioner Koch asked for any other public comments for or against the amendment to Ordinance 05-2017. Having none, Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular meeting at 9:20 a.m., and called for a motion.

* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Ordinance 05-2017, amending text to extend permit expiration as found in Franklin County Code Section 1, 15.12.230. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney presented to the Board information regarding the purpose of the Public Hearing.

On June 29, 2016, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners approved Franklin County's transportation improvement plan for 2017-2022 (Res. 2016-260). Since the adoption of the TIP in June, the plan will need to be amended to add projects due to a current call-for-projects, or project scheduling issues.

2017-2022 TIP recommended to the additions include:

Per RCW 36.81.121(1), the transportation improvement act may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the legislative body of the jurisdiction after a public hearing has been held. The public was notified by advertisement in the County's legal newspaper and a public hearing was held on June 28, 2017.

Commissioner Koch recessed into a Public Hearing at 9:29 a.m., to hear testimony regarding proposed amendment to the Adopted 2017-2022 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program.

Commissioner Koch asked for Public comment. Having none, Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular meeting at 9:31 a.m., and called for a motion.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve amendments to the adopted 2017-2022 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING

Commissioner Koch recessed into a Public Hearing at 9:34a.m., to hear testimony regarding the Adoption of Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for 2018-2023.

Commissioner Koch asked for Public comment. Having none, Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular meeting at 9:35 a.m., and called for a motion.

* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Adoption of Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for 2018-2023. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney presented Resolution 2017-180, a petition for vacation of a portion of Horseshoe Lane to the Board.

Discussion on the position of the road boundaries, its usage and who has legal ownership of property occurred.

Ms. Toni Meacham, property owner of Horseshoe Lane spoke to the Board regarding her concerns with the existing road and why she is petitioning for its vacancy.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-180, a petition for vacation of a portion of Horseshoe Lane. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.
