Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Brad Peck called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

August 14, 2018 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes approved as presented.

9:02 AM Approve Request to Sell Tax Title Property- Resolution 2018-263

Treasurer Josie Koelzer and Foreclosure Deputy Whitney Skelton presented the Board with a background of this request. Tax Parcel 112490038 failed to sell at auction in 12/1997, this property is .21 acres of undeveloped land. The adjoining property owner has submitted an Application for Re-Sale of Tax Title Property with a minimum bid of \$1,000.00 to purchase the property at public auction. This request will meet the RCW 36.35.150 requirements.

* After a brief discussion, the Commissioners agreed to place this parcel of land with a group of parcels that will go before the Board in December with a minimum bid of two-thousand dollars. Resolution 2018-263 was denied.

9:16 AM Road Name Change of Richview Drive to Bair Drive

County Engineer Craig Erdman presented the background and updates on the name of Richview Drive.

On February 8th, 2018 the Board of County Commissioner received a request from Kirk and Debbie Bair of 51 Richview Drive Pasco, Washington requesting a road name change of Richview Drive to Bair Drive.

On July 17th, 2018 the Board of County Commissioners, upon the recommendation of the County Engineer, approved the Resolution 2018-230 changing the Name of Richview Drive to Bair Road. Due to an oversight by the Public Works Department, local residents of Richview

Drive were not adequately notified of the potential name change and not provided with the opportunity to provide public comments.

On July 24th, 2018 Letters were sent out to seven landowners (see attached mailing list) along and around Richview Drive, impacted by the road name change providing these impacted landowners an opportunity to provide public comment. Comments were requested to be submitted by August 10th, 2018, otherwise additional comments could be voiced at the August 21st, 2018 Commissioner's meeting.

On August 10th, 2018 the deadline to provide public comment in writing expired, to which the office of the County Engineer's Office received two letter (see attached copies) in opposition of the road name change and no letters in support of the road name change were received.

On August 14th, 2018 a Resolution was submitted and approved by the Board of County Commissioners to rescind Resolution 2018-230, Road Name Change of Richview Drive to Bair Road, in an effort to afford the public an opportunity to provide comment on the road name change.

The name Bair Road does not duplicate or sound similar to any other roads within Franklin or Benton County, the addressing impacts will affect 8 addresses, of which, a portion of the addresses belong to the family that has applied for the road name change.

Debbie Bair addressed the Board with her concerns with the emergency response to this address. Ms. Bair explained that recently her son needed immediate medical attention and she called 911. Six men showed up from fire districts however, they were not equipped to help him, as they needed a medic. The ambulance showed up one half hour later due to confusion of address.

Citizen Michelle Andres agreed that changing the name for emergency purposes would improve the emergency response time.

After discussion, Resolution 2018-264 was tabled until September 30th 2018 or before if it returns sooner. The Commissioners would like to give Ms. Bair the opportunity to visit with their neighbors and obtain an agreement of support for the road name change. The Commissioners would revisit this request at a later date.
