Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 11:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

December 18, 2018 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes January 15, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minute

Commissioners approved Minutes as presented.

11:02 a.m. Closed Record Hearing

Conditional Use Permit 2018-07 Allowing Expansion of a Dairy Farm AHBL Personal Services Contractor Nicole Stickney stated this is a closed record hearing on a Conditional Use Permit application to allow the expansion of a dairy farm to 1,500 head at 433 Dessert Road, Othello, WA 99344. (Parcel Number 120-020-020). The site is located on Farm Unit 8, Irrigation Block 11 of the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project and is situated in Section 2, Township 14 North, Range 29 East, W.M. Franklin County Washington. The Planning Commission recommended conditional approval of the CUP, and there were no appeals filed on the recommendation.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Conditional Use Permit 2018-07 to allow a dairy expansion, as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

11:06 a.m. Public Hearing

Supplemental Budget Increase of \$363,000, for acceptance of Grant from Washington Health Care for Opioid Treatment in Corrections Facility. Administrator Keith Johnson explained that in order to accept the state Grant funds, the county would need to open the budget in a Public Hearing to make changes for the increase.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-045 as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

11:08 a.m. Discussion with Heart to Heart Syringe Exchange Program Benton Franklin Health District.

Director of Environmental Health Rick Dawson from Benton Franklin Health District gave a background of the Blue Mountain Heart to Heart program, and its beginning in Franklin County. Mr. Dawson announced that this program is in existence in Walla Walla and Yakima currently. The Health District received a request two years ago from Blue Mountain Heart to Heart staff to consider opening the program in Franklin County. The Agency met with the staff members for approximately twelve months to obtain data. Mr. Dawson described to the Board data that was acquired.

November 2017 the Board of Health pursued a contract with Blue Mountain Heart to Heart. In February 2018, the Board of Health requested authorization from Franklin County Commissioners, to use space in the leased space the Health District was using from the county. In May 2018, the syringe exchange program opened.

Commissioner Koch, Chair of the Health Board at that time, stated that he would not bring the program before the Franklin County Commissioners until the City of Pasco and Law Enforcement weighed in on program. The Commissioners had evaluated the data and operation of the program, as well as Tim Waters, Director of WSU extension.

Dr. Amy Person delivered information on the opioid response program and the four areas in which they are focusing on: 1. Improve prescriber practices, 2. Increase access to treatment, 3. Reducing opioid overdoses, 4. Improve data collection. Dr. Person is an advocate of the program.

Commissioner Didier asked questions in regards to the amount of needles distributed and if counseling was included in the program.

Everett Maroon from Blue Mountain Heart to Heart responded that in 2018, the return of needle exchange rate was 93% and counseling was outsourced.

Commissioner Koch opened up the floor for public comment.

- Lisa Thomas, a registered nurse, worked at Lourdes inpatient drug and alcohol treatment facility and at Harbor View Neurology floor. Ms. Thomas has worked with drug addicts and opposes the syringe exchange program.
- Charles Eaton ran the first government approved and funded Syringe Exchange Study in New York City and is in favor of the syringe exchange program.
- O Nadean Pulfer PA works with substance abuse disorder patients in the Tri-city area. Ms. Pulfer is in favor of the syringe exchange program.
- o Madeline Brown from Walla Walla, spoke to the largest population who use opioids are those who have had traumatic experiences in their life. Most clients self-medicate and Heart to Heart helps mitigate. Ms. Brown is in favor of the syringe exchange program.
- Jeffery Robinson has a background working with foster children and at-risk youth. He is favor of the syringe exchange program.
- Ron VanDinter concerned about the amount of needles delivered without accountability.
 He read a portion of a publication from the Center for Disease Control vital signs report in US World News.
 Mr. VanDinter is opposed to the syringe exchange program.
- Trevor Hummel a former opioid addict and user testified that this program only enables users and does not help the addict. He has witnessed first-hand the addicts sharing needles. Mr. Hummel is opposed of the syringe exchange program.
- O James Gimenez is opposed of the syringe exchange program and is concerned that his children are attending their 4-H programs in the same building in which Blue Mountain Heart to Heart exists.
- o Greater Columbia Accountable Community of Health Executive Director Carol Moser informed the Board of different pathways to deal with opioid use disorder treatment. There is a need for programs and she is in favor of the syringe exchange program.
- O Deputy Director of Greater Columbia Accountable Community of Health Wes Luckey supports Carol Moser's comments. Mr. Luckey presented data on opioid use in nine counties, with Tri-cities having the largest amount of prescription opioid use. He supports the syringe exchange program.
- Cindy Hanna is in favor of the syringe exchange program. Her son is an addict and she is
 grateful for the program and the opportunity she has to get Narcan in case there is an over
 dose.
